

Playwright's Note:

Bacon is about what happens when teenagers learn to bully and humiliate each other before they learn to love and accept themselves. The play is based on real events. Its two central characters, Mark and Darren, were born from an act of bullying I witnessed, which led me to explore the idea of learned negative behaviours. Subsequently, other experiences attached themselves to the story. I began to connect the bullying incident to an intense and semi-toxic relationship I had experienced growing up. It was a confusing, dangerously exciting time; and through the play I intend to encompass that light, teenage, carefree lack of perspective, full of blindness.

A number of audience members, regardless of age or gender, have said on seeing the play, 'this is my story'. The notion that the boys' story is, in some ways, everyone's story, is what makes it a complex and vital narrative through which to explore identity and sexuality. The play also explores the binaries of class in relation to sexuality, and how confidence and acceptance can be closely related to social standing, from family to family.

Bacon is a relationship drama for the modern age. At once tragic and euphoric, it questions whether we can do better to guide teenagers through the process of becoming adults. At the heart of Bacon, is the study of the journey from boy to man, and why so often, boys fail to make it there. My writing journey began in Los Angeles eleven years ago, when I was studying at Occidental College. Since then I have been slowly building a career as a playwright in London. It means so much to me to be able to return to Los Angeles with my play, Bacon, and I would like to thank Rogue Machine for their commitment and belief in this story.

Bacon has scooped up a number of awards during its lifetime: the Tony Craze Award at Soho Theatre (2018), 4 x Off West End Awards (2022), London Pub Theatre Award for Best Production (2022) The Peggy Ramsay/Film4 Award (2023)

SOPHIE SWITHINBANK (PLAYWRIGHT)

Sophie is a multi-award-winning playwright and screenwriter, based in London. She is the 2023 winner of the Peggy Ramsay/Film4 Award. Her play *Beans* won the 2024 Sonia Friedman Prize for Best Play, and her play *Bacon* (Tony Craze Award Winner 2018) ran at Finborough Theatre in 2022, to critical acclaim, winning four Off West End Awards. *Bacon* has toured UK, Australia, Canada and USA. Sophie has recently completed an attachment at the National Theatre, with whom she is developing an NT Connections play. Sophie has two new plays and a musical in development. For Theatre: *Even in Arcadia* (longlisted for Verity Bargate Award 2020), *Circle Game* (Southwark Theatre, shortlisted for Phil Fox Award 2020), *Where There Is Smoke* (National Theatre Learning), *Come Inside* (Bush Theatre) and *The Superhero* (Lyric Hammersmith). GUILLERMO CIENFUEGOS (ARTISTIC DIRECTOR)

Guillermo Cienfuegos serves as Artistic Director at Rogue Machine. He directed the RMT productions of *Evanston Salt Costs Climbing, Heroes of the Fourth Turning, Middle of the World, The Beautiful People, Disposable Necessities, Ready Steady Yeti Go* and *Dutch Masters*. Cienfuegos won both

the Ovation and Los Angeles Drama Critics Circle Awards for Best Director for his production of Shakespeare's Henry V at Pacific Resident Theatre. He has directed numerous productions at PRT, including Ionesco's Rhinoceros, Pinter's The Homecoming and Safe at Home: An Evening with Orson Bean. Other theatre directing credits include *Julia*, both at PRT and at New York's 59E59 theatre, Off-Broadway, the World Premiere of Middle of the World at Boise Contemporary Theatre, the World Premiere of Christmas Contigo at Oregon Cabaret Theatre, the Los Angeles Premiere of Stephen Adly Guirgis' Pulitzer Prize winner Between Riverside and Crazy at the Fountain Theatre and most recently Shaw's Misalliance and Shakespeare's Much Ado About Nothing at A Noise Within.
