# Why did you choose to write this play?

The sheer number of states in the Southern US with felony punishments (and even those with only misdemeanor infractions) in response to lack of disclosure and/or passing HIV on to another is deepseated homophobia that is worth exposing to communities outside that region as well as allies who may be poised to act. Three of these Southern states-Arkansas, Tennessee, and Louisiana-require "those found guilty of knowingly exposing a partner are required to be registered as a sex offender." There are 32 states where felony punishments are the default for convictions, though the South is worthwhile for exploring because Black Southern Queer people are more likely to live with HIV.




